



Monday 1/8	<p>PROMPT #1</p> <p>Do you love, hate, can't stop reading this book? What makes you feel that way? Give specific reasons and examples from the book.</p>
Tuesday 1/9	<p>PROMPT #2</p> <p>Congratulations! You've just been promoted to the position of editor-in chief of the most powerful newspaper in the country! It's your job to come up with headlines for stories.</p> <p>Create five possible headlines for the events you read about in your book. Remember, headlines need to be short, informative, attention grabbing, and true. Use details from the text.</p>
Wednesday 1/10	<p>PROMPT #3</p> <p>We wear different shoes for different purposes—jogging shoes, sneakers, dancing shoes, hiking shoes. After you finish reading, consider the different characters' actions. Choose three characters and design a shoe that reflects their action in the text.</p> <p>So, for example if your character is involved in a lot of action scenes (he/she is running, jumping). Then, you would draw sneakers and inside the sneaker tell what actions the character did.</p>
Thursday 1/11	<p style="text-align: center;">BREAK NIGHT</p> <p>This is your time to review the entries you have for this week. DO THEY ANSWER THE PROMPT? DO YOU HAVE MORE THAN ONE SENTENCE FOR EACH ENTRY? IS YOUR SPELLING AND PUNCTUATION CORRECT?</p>
Friday 1/12	<p>PROMPT #4</p> <p>I used to love to read the comics in the newspaper. The Sunday Comics were the best!!! How about you? Check out the newspaper and find the comic strips. Use your reading tonight and create a comic strip to represent your reading for tonight.</p> <p>Draw a comic strip or graphic novel page for what you just read.</p>
Weekend 1/13/14	<p>PROMPT #5</p> <p>Listen to a news story on TV tonight. Pretend you are famous reporter on TV. Write a brief news story about what you've read for the evening news.</p>
