



Monday 5/7	<p><b>PROMT #1</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>What a Word!</b></p> <p>Did the book you're reading lead you to discover a new word that you truly treasure? Write a few words from your reading tonight that you love, and its definition. Write why these words are important to the story.</p>
Tuesday 5/8	<p><b>PROMPT #2</b></p> <p>Readers often read the beginning of a book to help them decide whether to choose it, so authors try to make the beginning interesting. Authors might do the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• introduce an interesting setting</li> <li>• start with dialogue begin in the middle of the action</li> </ul> <p>Reread the first paragraph of your book write a paragraph about how the author made the beginning of the story interesting.</p>
Wednesday 5/9	<p><b>Prompt #3</b></p> <p>Authors don't tell readers everything about a character. They write stories so readers can figure out what type of person a character is. Authors give clues so readers can make inferences about a character's personality.</p> <p>Choose a character from your text: _____</p> <p>Think about what you know about this character. Draw a picture of the character, and write his or her name. Then, write details about the character. You can include any nicknames, physical details (what he or she looks like), personality traits (what type of person he or she is), and the character's feelings and actions.</p>
